
## **Information Wanted**



Part of a memorial stone has been found in Lighthorne and it may have originally been located in the churchyard, though there is no evidence for this. We are keen to replace it in the churchyard, hopefully in its correct position and in order that we can do this we need assistance with the identification of the deceased person. The memorial stone is small and may have been placed in the area of ashes interment, near the war memorial, in the churchyard. The partial inscription reads as follows:

WILLIAM AR
WEBB
SUDDENLY 2<sup>ND</sup> APR[IL]
[A]GED 64 YEA[RS]
YLOV[E]

The rest of the inscription is missing. William Webb's second name may have been Arnold or Arthur or Archibald or a more obscure name. However it seems unlikely that it was Arnold, as there is no trace of the first vertical stroke of a letter "N" after the letter "R". There is no year of death remaining on the stone.

We have searched the internet extensively for details of the burial of William Webb, but without success. If anyone knows any details about him or his family we would be pleased if you would contact the society.
